

Music of Carole King -ballad, riff 'you've got a friend', 60s/70s, addition of voices and instruments make get louder (crescendo)music dies away at end (diminuendo), civil rights, gender equality,

You've got a friend -Carole King

One Fine Day - The Chiffons

Will You Still Love Me Tomorrow - Carole King

Vocabulary		
blues	Style characterised by its harmonic structure and the notes used to create melodies.	
groove	The rhythmic part of the music that makes you want to move and dance.	
Motown	1960s label from soul music. Characterised by rhythm playing and groove with a funky baseline.	
Neo Soul	Songs mixed in the studio to sound as if they are from an older era.	
timbre	The sound quality of the instrument.	
Middle 8	Contrasting section that leads back to the main material.	
ostinato	Short repeated rhythmic or melodic pattern.	
diminuendo	a decrease in loudness in a piece of music	
crescendo	a gradual increase in loudness in a piece of music	
dynamics	Variation in volume.	
hook	A musical phase that stands out and is remembered.	
riff	A repeated chord, pattern or melody.
