

How you can help your child

Although we do not formally set homework there are many ways that you can help your child at home.

Reading with your child and sharing a story with them will help build their love of books and reading for pleasure. We are pushing a love of reading for pleasure throughout school and have a range of books available in school for children to read at home and return, or you could even take a visit to your local library. There is a book out there everyone.

Inside each child's Learning Log are different activities they could complete at home for each different half term. As well as different activities there are also statutory spellings your child could practise writing. You could encourage them to spell the words in different colours, bubble writing or even put them in a silly sentence.

You will also see in the front of the Learning Log there is a Spelling Shed log in and a Times Table Rockstars log in. These are a fantastic way children are able to practise their spellings (weekly assignments are set) and master their times tables. In the summer term of year 4, children are expected to take a multiplication check which will check fluency of 1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8,9,10,11 and 12 times tables.
