


Disco -strong drums and bass lines. Fast tempo with steady dance groove. Electric guitar. 1970s New York.

Vocabulary		
structure	How different sections in a piece of music are put together.	
introduction	A section that opens a piece of music before the theme or lyrics.	
verse	A repeated section that features a new set of lyrics for each repetition.	
chorus	A part of the song that is repeated after the verse.	
improvise	To make your own music.	
pentatonic scale	Musical scale with 5 notes per octave ($C D E G A$)	
compose	To create own music.	
texture	How the tempo, melody and harmony are put together to give an overall sound.	
dynamics	Variation in volume.	
melody	The tune.	
hook	A musical phase that stands out and is remembered.	
riff	A repeated chord, pattern or melody.
